

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
Top 10 Tertrait Artists 2017

Tith a rise in popularity of portraiture, this May we showcase 10 of the very best, all with very different styles and mediums. But what traditionally defines art that is described as a portrait?

"A portrait is a painting, photograph, sculpture, or other artistic representation of a person, in which the face and its expression is predominant. The intent is to display the likeness, personality, and even the mood of the person. For this reason, in photography a portrait is generally not a snapshot, but a composed image of a person in a still position. A portrait often shows a person looking directly at the painter or photographer, in order to most successfully engage the subject with the viewer. Most early representations that are clearly intended to show an individual are of rulers, and tend to follow idealizing artistic conventions, rather than the individual features of the subject's body, though when there is no other evidence as to the ruler's appearance the degree of idealization can be hard to assess. Nonetheless, many subjects, such as Akhenaten and some other Egyptian pharaohs, can be recognised by their distinctive features.

Some of the earliest surviving painted portraits of people who were not rulers are the Greco-Roman funeral portraits that survived in the dry climate of Egypt's Fayum district. These are almost the only paintings from the classical world that have survived, apart from frescos, though many sculptures and portraits on coins have fared better. Although the appearance of the figures differs considerably, they are considerably idealized, and all show relatively young people, making it uncertain whether they were painted from life.

The art of the portrait flourished in Ancient Greek and especially Roman sculpture, where sitters demanded individualized and realistic portraits, even unflattering ones. During the 4th century, the portrait began to retreat in favor of an idealized symbol of what that person looked like. (Compare the portraits of Roman Emperors Constantine I and Theodosius I at their entries.) In the Europe of the Early Middle Ages representations of individuals are mostly generalized. True portraits of the outward appearance of individuals re-emerged in the late Middle Ages, in tomb monuments, donor portraits, miniatures in illuminated manuscripts and then panel paintings."





Crickhowell Open Studio Weekend embraces the Year of Legends

Crickhowell is set to bring the past to life in a unique fashion during the Spring Bank Holiday weekend this

In addition to the oriel CRiC gallery's annual Open Art Competition (26 May - 3 July) which this year includes a 'Legends of Wales' category, the town will welcome the "Beasts of the Mabinogion" exhibition (26 May - 23 June). Showcasing the artistry of 'Fauxidermy' textile artist and sculptor Helly Powell, the exhibition boasts a new body of work based on the Mabinogion, created using the cloth woven at Melin Tregwynt. Celebrating the literary heritage of the Mabinogion alongside the timeless textiles designed and created at the Welsh mill, the work reflects both Helly's creativity and the skill and tradition handed down through the generations of the family owned mill. Helly has invited jeweller Kathryn Willis, artist Robert Macdonald and printer Sarah Lane from Penrhos Printing Press to a collaboration by creating work which complements and enriches the exhibition.

The project has been funded by the Welsh Government's Tourism Product Innovation Fund which aims to encourage partnership working and innovative ideas which will have a greater impact and attract more visitors.

Crickhowell's Open Studio weekend (27 – 29 May) brings visitors from far and wide to the town. Numerous venues within walking distance give visitors the perfect excuse to linger over a cup of coffee or a meal while enjoying the rich variety of art on offer at the town's two galleries, many studios and exhibition spaces.

For their summer show (10 May to 1 July) the Tower Gallery Co-operative of artists will also be a showing work on the theme of Myths and Legends of Wales. Graeme Galvin and Lesley Lilywhite have both been inspired by the Welsh tales of the Mabinogion which has a special connection with this area. The Red Book of Hergest in which many of the tales were recorded was kept by the Vaughan family at Tretower and in the 19th century the stories were first translated and published in English by Charlotte Guest not far away in Dowlais.

The other members of the co-operative will be adding their own take on the theme of myth and legends, including Robert Macdonald who has taken inspiration from the stories that Giraldus collected in his travels through Wales in the 12th century, tales of the Lady of the Lake at Llyn y Fan Fach and of the birds of Llangorse. For this exhibition the group will be joined by Tim Rossiter whose work is deeply imbued with the resonance of poetry and myth. Both this and the oriel CRiC gallery's Open Art exhibition are not to be missed.

Whether lingering in Crickhowell or exploring further afield, the weekend offers an opportunity to enjoy the Brecon Beacons and Black Mountains by meeting the artists who are inspired by the natural beauty of the area. Further information can be found on:







The climax will be the now traditional "Big Free" weekend on both banks of the River Usk – the Hanbury Quayside, the Bell Inn, and on the Festival Field with live music from 45 bands/performers, arts/crafts, sculpture and exhibitors.


