his autumn, Ludlow Farm (former Ludlow Food Centre) plays host to a unique pop-up art gallery. 'The Artists' Gallery' will be housed in the ex 'Isla Bikes' showroom and will open on Saturday the 5th of October until the end of December.

As the name suggests the gallery will be managed and run by the artists themselves, giving buyers the exciting opportunity to meet and buy directly from the makers. The concept of the gallery was the brainchild of local wildlife artist Shelly Perkins, who sought to find a group of fellow creatives to join her in this exclusive opportunity to exhibit at this artisan retail site. The group now comprises a range of artists and crafts people working to the highest level in their chosen field, representing mediums including wood turning, print making, painting, sculpture and ceramics.

Priscilla Kennedy has been working as a bronze sculptor for nearly 50 years, her intricate pieces capture the essence of her subjects which range from race horses to dung beetles.

Danielle Flowers handcrafts contemporary turned home décor and accessories, utilizing native timber sustainably felled from the Shropshire landscape.

Megan Evans creates 'rubbish' art (literally!) by collecting litter from the natural landscape and using it to create her collagraph prints, adding delicate hand painted details.

Jan Jay is a textile designer creating hand printed textiles for soft furnishings as well as framed prints inspired by nature and rural Britain.

Pip Jones enjoys working in watercolour and mixed media. Her paintings are a celebration

of the landscape - the light, the weather, the seasons, time of day, her feelings and mood.

Sarah Billingham creates wheel thrown pots using white earthenware clay, decorated using various techniques including painting, sponging and sgraffito.

Wood turner Kim Davis creates vessels and objects that have the clean, calm lines of a timeless form, inspired by the intrinsic beauty of wood.

Shelly Perkins' digital prints showcase wildlife from both rural Britain and beyond, celebrating her love of all things nature and travel and translating that into rich and vibrant works of art.

A visit to the gallery will be a visual treat as well as the opportunity to learn about how each of the makers creates their work directly from the artists themselves. Visiting the gallery will be a great way of supporting small, rural businesses and will be an exciting injection of culture into the already thriving artistic community that Ludlow so successfully nurtures. ith a programme of changing exhibitions throughout the year the oriel CRiC gallery in Crickhowell continues to experience growing interest and appreciation of the variety of art and beautiful handcrafted items showcased.

Tim Rossiter's paintings in the autumn exhibition reflect his method of working imaginatively, with music, poetry, mythology and the Welsh landscape all providing themes, though the content is always his own. He works mainly in oil on panel, using successive layers of glazes to build up and adjust the colours and tones, a common enough process 400 years ago but less usual in contemporary practice.

Tim will be demonstrating his method in the gallery on the afternoon of Saturday the 5th October. Refreshments will be available throughout the afternoon - Everyone is welcome, and entry is free.

Alongside cups of tea and interesting conversations, Friday afternoons have become synonymous with a wonderful creative energy at the oriel CRiC gallery in Crickhowell. With the support of the Jean Williams legacy, Jan Winstanley and Ann Notley have created the opportunity to celebrate and share in the skill of hand embroidery.

Both are experienced and accomplished embroidery artists, with Ann a regular exhibitor at the gallery of stump work in which she recreates in stitch the abundance of wildflowers and insects that can be found where she lives on the edge of the Brecon Beacons National Park. And it is this skill that they both share with a great spirit of generosity in a welcoming, inclusive and encouraging atmosphere. Hosting these regular sessions, perfectly complements the gallery's ethos of inspiring others to explore their creativity. We are very much looking forward to supporting this group as they grow, initiate group projects and invite specialist tutors to impart new knowledge making the experience all the more enriching.



"I'm a self-taught ceramic animal sculptor based in Llangeitho, West Wales. My work draws from my life long fascination with animals and the natural world and is strongly informed by my academic understanding of animal behaviour, gained during and after being awarded my PhD investigating animal personality trait evolution. Each stoneware piece I create is decorated with applied ceramic underglazes with the aim to capture everyday moments in the lives of animals and hopefully reveal something previously unnoticed. By exploring these moments I also seek to provide insight

into animal behavior and how small changes in body form or expression can convey, not only information, but also provide insight into an individuals motivation and emotional state.





During the month of December I will also be presenting my solo spotlight exhibition at King Street Gallery, Carmarthen that explores the behaviour of our closet relatives; the great apes."




Rachel Hoyle's pieces are inspired by Instagram: heritage, culture and people, which she records through illustrations with ink on clay to produce functional, decorative ceramics. Slip cast from thrown originals, studio pottery qualities are evident conveying the maker's hand. The pieces often utilize the three dimensional surface as a canvas, which depict statement abstract and figurative marks on a subtly textured surface, glazed with a cool pallet punctuated with a dash of vivid colour or decadent gold.

Hoyle Ceramics is currently showing at Gallery 23 with Arteria, Lancaster until October and regularly exhibits with Cavaliero Finn, London.
